



Sample Searches: Periodicals Archive Online

1. You have been doing research in the ***Caribbean Review*** and want to find related journals. Assuming that Caribbean Review may have advertised in related journals, how do you find those journals?
 - Click **Article Search**.
 - Type “*caribbean review*” into the **Keyword(s)** field.
 - In the **Search Options** panel, uncheck all of the boxes under **Search in** except for **Other**.
 - Click **Search**.
2. You have heard that Charles Dickens first published ***Oliver Twist*** serially and under a pseudonym and you would like to find the first installation of the novel.
 - Click **Article Search**.
 - Type “*oliver twist*” into the **Article Title Keyword(s)** field.
 - Click **Search**.
 - On the Article Search Results page, click the **Sort results** drop-down box and select **Date (earliest first)**.
 - Click **Sort**.
3. The history of fashion course you are taking has assigned a research paper on the role of makeup in history. You have decided to look at theatrical makeup.
 - Click **Article Search**.
 - Type *cosmetic* or makeup* into the **Keyword(s)** field.
 - Click **select from a list** next to the **Journal Subject(s)** field.
 - Check the box next to **Performing Arts** in the list, then click **Select Terms**.
 - Click **Search**.
4. You are interested in looking at articles discussing John Calvin’s ***Institutes of the Christian Religion***. You realize after you start your search that you are most interested in what was being written during the 1940’s.
 - Click **Article Search**.
 - Type *calvin and institutes* into the **Keyword(s)** field.
 - Click **Search**.
 - On the **Article Search Results** page, click **Date** (in the **Filter By** panel).
 - Click **Show All**.
 - Click **1940 - 1949**.

5. Knowing that events and eras are named after the fact, you want to find the year when World War I first was referred to by that name in an article title. You think it probably happened sometime between 1935 and 1945.
 - Click **Article Search**.
 - Type "great war" or "first world war" or "world war 1" or "world war I" into the **Article Title Keyword(s)** field.
 - In the **Year of Publication** field, type 1935 in the **From** box and 1945 in the **to** box.
 - Click **Search**.

6. You are interested in finding economics journals that also cover political science topics.
 - Click **Find Journals** then click **Search Journal Records**.
 - Click **select from a list** next to the **Journal Subject(s)** field.
 - Check the box next to **Economics** in the list, then click **Select Terms**.
 - Click **Search**.
 - On the **Journal Record Search Results** page, click **Journal Subjects** (in the **Filter By** panel).
 - Click **Political Science**.
