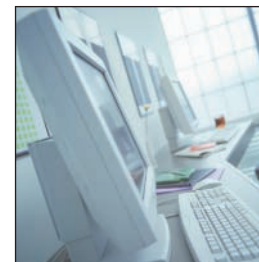

A Treasury of Sources

A single search within C19 scours all 11 million-plus records, eliciting quick results from:

- **Books**—1.3 million records from the Nineteenth Century Short Title Catalogue (NSTC), the renowned bibliographic database that catalogs the holdings of eight of the world's top research libraries:
 - British Library
 - Bodleian Library (Oxford)
 - Cambridge University Library
 - Trinity College Dublin Library
 - National Library of Scotland
 - Newcastle University Library
 - Harvard University Library
 - Library of Congress



Now available for the first time are 25,000 additional 19th-century British Library records that enhance the original NSTC compilation.

- **Periodicals**—C19 incorporates three major periodical indices with article-level detail:

- Periodicals Index Online™** (formerly PCI)—The major index for periodicals in the humanities and social sciences worldwide, it provides records for over 3.4 million journal articles from more than 900 19th-century journals. (C19 includes active links to full text for Periodicals Archive Online customers.)

- American Periodicals Series (APS) Online™**—This full-image resource indexes more than 3 million articles from over 1,100 rare and well-known American magazines and newspapers from the 19th century. (Active links for APS Online customers.)

- The Wellesley Index to Victorian Periodicals, 1824-1900**—The first online version of this invaluable scholarly resource indexes 43 important Victorian periodicals and identifies many anonymous and pseudonymous contributors. C19 includes active links to 20,000 articles for Periodicals Archive Online customers.

- **Newspapers**—Launched in 1868, **Palmer's Index to the Times** is nearly as famous as the newspaper it indexes. It's the only index covering the 19th-century run of this legendary London newspaper. (C19 features active links for customers with the Chadwyck-Healey Palmer's Index.)
- **Government Documents**—The index to the Chadwyck-Healey House of Commons Parliamentary Papers (HCPP) will feature records for 99,000 papers issued by the British House of Commons between 1801 and 1919. This essential index covers it all—Bills, Reports of Committees, Reports of Commissioners—and represents a gateway to documents that influenced political and social philosophy the world over. (Active links to full text for HCPP customers.)

Much of this content has been indexed in few other sources. For some, this is the only indexing available. C19 even includes records for some foreign-language literature. It's this breadth of coverage that makes C19 the consummate 19th-century index.

Smarter Searching

Users of C19 can search across common bibliographic elements in all 11 million records by keyword, title keyword, author, and date. Results can be sorted alphabetically, by publication type (books, articles, newspapers, or government documents), by relevance, and by date.

Search screens for each individual collection provide more advanced search and browse options across multiple specialized fields such as periodical subject, publisher, language, and more. Boolean operators, wildcards, proximity, and truncation are also supported.

Users can also record their Search History, save records and searches to My Archive, and mark, print, or email records.

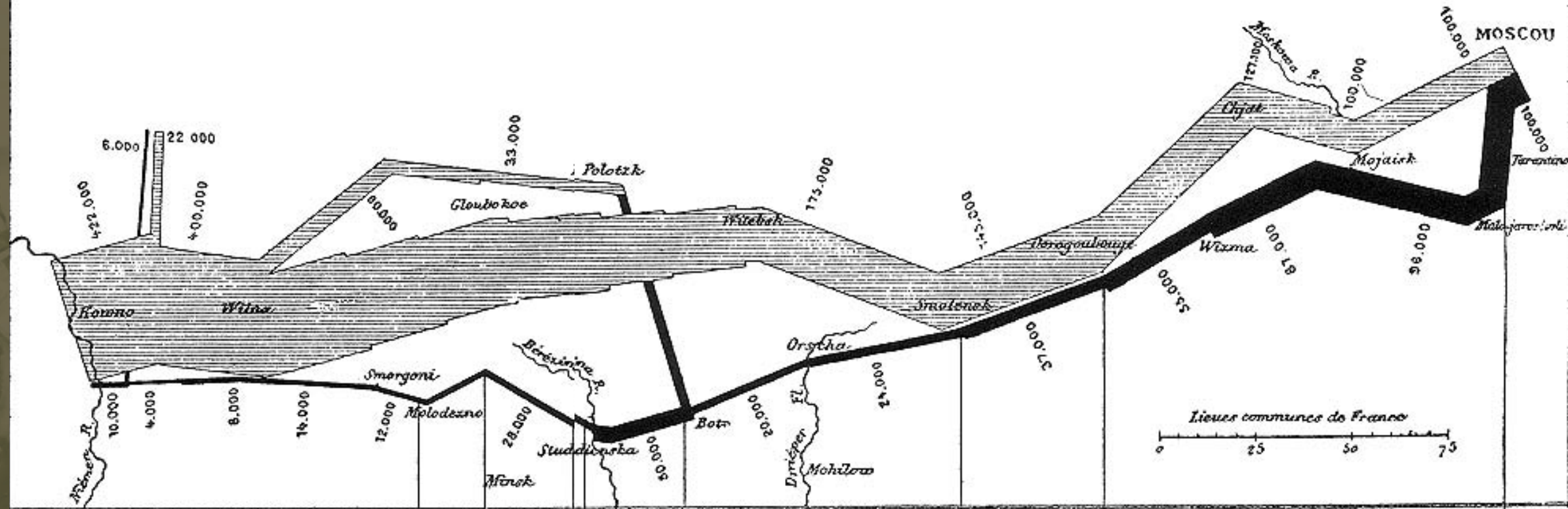
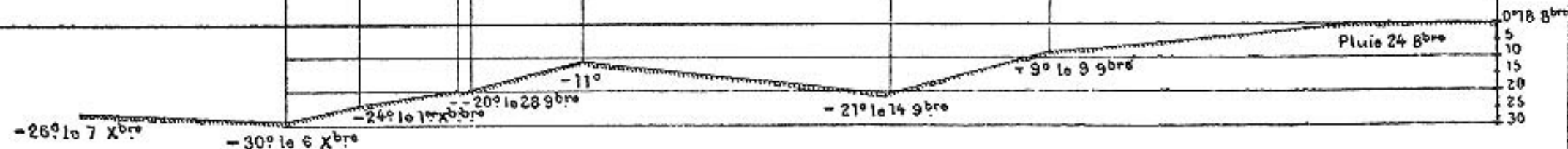


TABLEAU GRAPHIQUE de la température en degrés du thermomètre de Réaumur au dessous de zéro

Bonaparte's Retreat, 1812-1813

Loved by many in Europe for his stance on "The Rights of Man," Napoleon was the anathema of countless others. His catastrophic retreat from Moscow, with staggering losses to the French army, inspired innumerable works—including Tchaikovsky's "1812 Overture," French cartographic classics, Irish airs, and English poems (as well as 20th-century comparisons to Hitler's ill-fated invasion of Russia.)

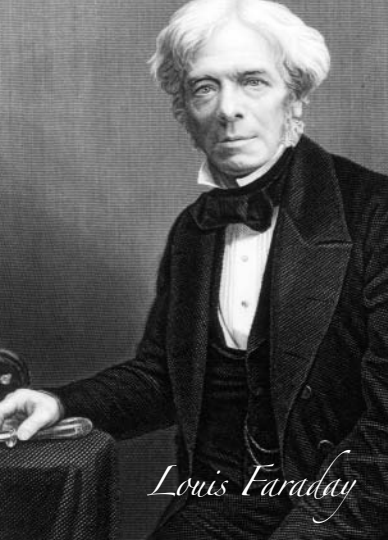

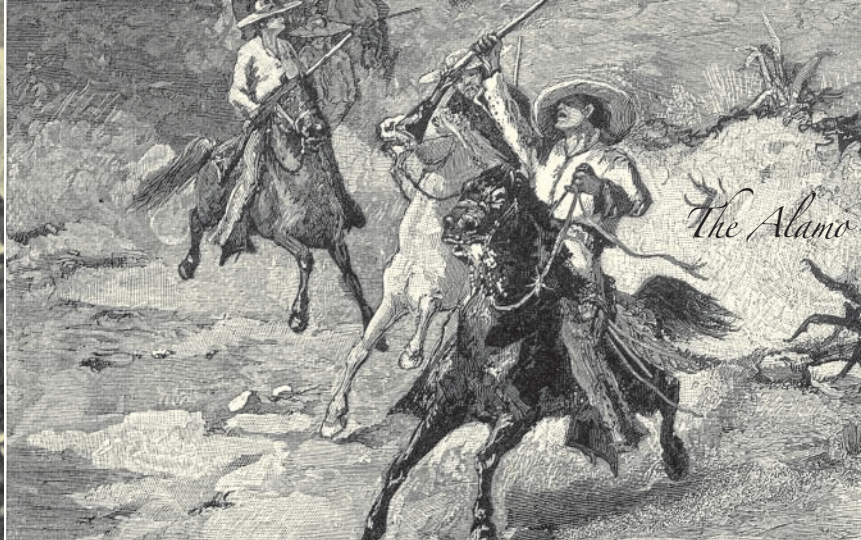
