An annual bibliography of books and articles on modern languages and literatures, linguistics, folklore, and related topics, the MLA International Bibliography covers literature from throughout the world—Africa, Asia, Australia, Europe, and North and South America. ■ Linguistics and language materials include history and theory of linguistics, comparative linguistics, semantics, stylistics, syntax, and translation. Other topics include literary theory and criticism, dramatic arts (film, radio, television, theater), teaching of

language and literature, rhetoric and composition, and history of printing and publishing. ■ As a standalone research collection, MLAIB offers all this:

### The MLA Module and ABELL—Perfect Complements

The add-on module makes Literature Online the only resource that allows single-point searching of the two leading literary indexes, MLA and ABELL. MLA offers an index to working papers, conference proceedings, reference works, and literature in non-English languages; ABELL indexes critical editions of literary works and book reviews. ■ Users can search MLA or ABELL individually or cross-search them by:

- Keyword
- Title keyword
- Subject (includes all MLA subject terms)
- Author/Reviewer
- Publication Details (including MLA Series and Publisher fields)
- Journal
- Publication year

Users can also specify all citations or limit them to books, reviews, or literary works, as well as to full-text articles only.

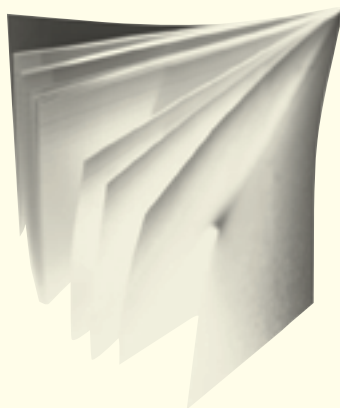
